What is flyball?

Flyball is a fast-paced exciting sport with teams of four dogs competing in relay races. Each dog jumps over four hurdles spaced 10 feet apart, catches a ball from a spring-loaded box, and returns over the hurdles with the ball. The first team of four dogs to complete the course without errors wins the heat.

Flyball requires a high level of teamwork and involves handlers and helpers of all ages.
